Good News Story

The “Special Needs Fund” is used to assist tenants during difficult times. How it is used varies and is at the discretion of the Community Worker with approval from the Board.

The availability of this fund was most helpful to a 60 year old woman living in one of our facilities. She took a retraining course after being unemployed for some time. She was still unable to obtain employment after completing this course. When she fell behind in her rent payments, I met with her to see if we could come up with a plan to avoid eviction.

She was ineligible for Ontario Works as the amount she was collecting from Canada Pension Plan was about the same amount as the benefit she could receive as a single person with no dependants. Needless to say, she had a major shortfall each month to meet her living expenses. We arranged an interest free loan from the Special Needs Fund, as she did not want a free hand-out, to pay for one month’s rent while she continued to seek employment.

Now she is employed. Beginning at minimum wage, she has worked up to a management level. She has repaid almost the full amount of her loan, planning to make her last payment soon.

Because of the Special Needs Fund, this woman was able to stay in her home with her dignity intact.
